January 18th - DAVID LLOYD: The History of Bolton Co-op

It's often said you never forget your Co-op 'divi' number, and we'll all be reminded of this when David makes a welcome return to WLHG to talk about the local origins of this renowned institution.

February 15th - JUDY BEESTON: Edith Rigby

This promises to be a fascinating presentation by a first-time visitor, who is a leading "member of Preston's 'Friends of Winkley Square'. Most of us are familiar with the story of infamous suffragette Edith Rigby torching Lord Leverhulme's bungalow in Rivington in 1913, but this talk will tell us much more about a remarkable woman.

March 21st - RUTH DUCKWORTH: My Life in Cricket (Part2)

WLHG committee member Ruth was born into a sporting family, with a very famous uncle who became a Lancashire cricketing legend, and represented England in 24 Test Matches. 'Uncle George' was a great influence on many family members, and indeed helped Ruth herself change history!

March 28th - EXCURSION: Harewood House & Gardens, Yorkshire

Organised day excursion to see one of the Treasure Houses of England. Built in the 18th century and has art collections to rival the finest in Britain. Visitors can enjoy exhibitions of contemporary art, a Farm Experience and over 100 acres of exquisite gardens to explore. Whilst sold out, additional demand can be accommodated with a larger coach.

April 18th - JUDITH ATKINSON: Worsley Delph & Green Industrial Complex

Worsley Delph is internationally-renowned as a place of huge historic significance, dating back to a mediaeval manor, and later as the basin of the iconic Bridgwater Canal. A regular visitor to WLHG, Judith has an encyclopaedic knowledge of local industrial history, and her presentation will inform us of the major improvements to the site completed in 2019.

April 25th - DRAMA EVENT: ON THE GO present 'Changing Times'

With stories recreating times gone by this Bolton-based Amateur Theatre Company will take us back to life in the 1960s with another not-to-be-missed performance. A nostalgic journey with much humour. Ticketed event. Venue: Carnegie Hall.

May 16th - STEPHEN IRWIN: Lancashire & The English Civil War

"A GENERAL PLAGUE OF MADNESS" is how Stephen describes the manifold battles between Royalists and Parliamentarians during a frenetic period in the mid-17th century. In addition to the dates (1642 to 1651) we'll know much about this colourful episode in English history in the wake of Stephen's presentation.

June 20th - BRIAN GROOM: Manchester - The Story Of The City That Shaped The Modern World

The successful author of 'Northerners' returns to WLHG to tell of Manchester's rise to global prominence, near-terminal decline, and more recent miraculous re-birth.
